The NCC unit of Dasmesh Girls College is the heart of the 12 PB NCC, Hoshiarpur. In the academic session 2020-21, the cadets attended various local and national events. The Cadets celebrated Independence Day with zeal and vigour and also planted trees to maintain the ecological balance of the environment. A National Webinar on “Legal Awareness, Protection from Violence and Abuse against Children” was attended by the students of NSS. They were also shown National Youth Parliament Festival of 2021 from the Central Hall of Parliament. Besides, Awareness Campaigns on ‘COVID-19 Vaccine’, ‘Pulse Polio Vaccination’, were also carried out. An Essay Writing and Poster Making Competition were held to mark the 125 years of Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose’s Birth Anniversary. A documentary related to the life of the great man was also shown to NSS volunteers. From 18 Jan, 2021 to 17, Feb 2021 was observed as Road Safety Awareness Month by NSS; in which various activities during the course of the month were done like Sharing the rules of Safety on Social Media, Participation in Online Quiz on Road Safety, Poster Making on Rules of Road Safety, Women’s Two–Wheeler Rally was also carried out.
