

## **ELIGIBILITIES**

## Admission to B.A. Semester-I

A person who has passed one of the following examinations with pass in English as one of the subjects shall be eligible to join the First Semester class of B.A. (General) degree course in a College affiliated to this University, however, a person who has not qualified English as one of the subjects at the +2 examinations, shall be eligible to join B.A.-Ist Semester provisionally subject to his/her qualifying the deficient subject of English from the parent Board/Body/ Council/ University in two consecutive chances subsequent to his/her admission, failing which her admission to B.A. Ist Semester and the result for the examination shall automatically stand cancelled:-

- (i) B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. Part-I (Old Scheme)/ Intermediate/Arts/ Science/ Agriculture examination of Panjab University.
  - (ii) the +2 examination under 10+2+3 system of education of a recognized University/Board/Council.
- (iii) Park Shastri/Vishard examination with compulsory English. (Vide Senate Para-LXXVII dated 06.12.2009).
  - (iv) any other examination recognized by the University as equivalent to (i), (ii) and (iii) above
- (v) Computer Science at the B.A./B.Sc. level if he/she has passed the +2 examination with Science/Commerce/Economics/Mathematics and Computer related subject like Computer Science/Information Technology etc. as one of the elective subjects or optional subjects.

## Combination of Subjects

- (a) English
- (b) Punjabi Or History and Culture of Punjab
- (c) Environment Subject

Note: A Student can have 2 practical subjects together.

#### (d) Elective Subjects

- (iv) Pol. Science/Computer Science
- (v) Physical Education/Computer Science/ Music Vocal
- (vii) Fashion Designing

## B.A. SEMESTER III & IV AND B.A. SEMESTER V & VI

Note: Students in B.A. Semester III & IV and Semester V & VI will continue with the same subjects as studied in B.A. Semester I & II.

## Eligibility for Admission to B.A. Semester III and IV

A person who has passed any of the following examinations shall be eligible to join the third semester of B.A., as the case may be:

- 1. B.A. Semester II of this university from this college.
- 2. Any other examination recognised by Panjab University as equivalent to its B.A. Semester II examination.

## Eligibility for Admission to B.A. Semester V and VI

A person who has passed any of the following examinations shall be eligible to join the fifth Semester of B.A., as the case may be:

- 1. B.A. IV Semester of this university.
- 2. Any other examination recognised by Panjab University as equivalent to its B.A. IV Semester examination.

### B.C.A. (40 Seats) Semester I

### ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION TO B.C.A. SEMESTER I

A person who has passed the following examinations shall be eligible to join the B.C.A. course:

- (a) +2 examination in any discipline with 50% marks in aggregate.
- (b) Matriculation examination having passed with Mathematics as one of the subjects.
- (c) Any other examination recognised by the Syndicate as equivalent to (a) above.

Note: A candidate who has been placed under compartment in the +2 examination is not eligible for seeking

# ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION TO B.C.A. SEMESTER III & IV AND SEMESTER V & VI

Admission to B.C.A. Semester III and Semester V shall be open to a person who has passed B.C.A. Semester Il and Semester IV respectively from Panjab University, Chandigarh.

## BACHELOR OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (B.B.A. 40 Seats)

#### Eligibility for Admission to B.B.A. Semester I

A Candidate should have passed +2 examination with 50% marks in aggregate of any discipline.

A candidate who has been placed under compartment in the +2 examination conducted by a Board/Bodies/Councils/University in India shall be eligible to seek admission to the First Semester of BBA course, provided he/she fulfills the following conditions:-

- (i) He/She should have been placed compartment in one subject only.
- (ii) He/She should have obtained at least 20% marks in the subject in which he/she had been placed in compartment; and
- (iii) He/She should have obtained the requisite percentage of marks in the aggregate of the examination as laid down in the relevant regulations.

The admission of the candidate with a compartment as indicated above shall be provisional and will be confirmed only after he/she has cleared the compartment in two consecutive chances subsequent to his/her admission. In case the candidate does not clear the compartment at any of the two consecutive chances allowed to him/her admission, his/her provisional admission to the course shall stand cancelled.

*Explanation:* In case of a compartment candidate, eligibility shall be determined by including the marks of the subject in which the candidate has been placed under compartment.

Eligiblity for Admission to B.Sc. Semester 1

A student who desires to seek admission in B.Sc. Semester I must have:

- 1. +2 class (Non-Medical/Medical) of the Senior Secondary Education of Punjab School Education Board (Mohali)
  - 2. Any other examination recognised by university as equivalent to examination mentioned above.
  - 3. She should have secured at least 40% of the total aggregate.

#### NOTE:

Mathematics

- A Student whose result of +2 examination conducted by the School Board / C.B.S.E (result of such school as are located in the jurisdiction of the regional Universities / Chandigarh, U.T. or examination conducted by Panjab University) is published late may be admitted to an affiliated College without late fee with in 15 working days of the declaration of the result and her attendance shall be counted from the date of admission. This would also be applicable in the case of open school of C.B.S.E ,New Delhi / National Open School of Delhi. In all such cases the Principal shall certify after certification of the declaration of the result.
- Candidates who have passed +2 examination without English from any recognised Board / Body/Council/ University are
  eligible to join B.Sc. Semester I class if they fulfill other requirements such as minimum percentage of marks.
- 3. A Student joining B.Sc. Semester I course shall select her subject in accordance with the restrictions laid down in regulations.
- 4. A Candidate joining B.Sc. Semester I class should have obtained at least 50% marks in aggregate of all subjects including the marks obtained by her in the subject of compartment (20%), Theory and Practicals taken up by her at +2 examination.

### REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMISSION

- 1. Students seeking admission to any class are required to produce in original the certificate of having passed the previous examinations and to attach an attested copy of each of the same with the admission form along with a character certificate from the Head of the institution last attended.
- 2. Detailed marks-card in original, (in case of compartment) must be attached for admission to B.A. Semester I.
- 3. Those who are already registered must produce their Panjab University Registration Card at the time of admission.

- A student belonging to Schedule Caste or Backward Class will be required to attach with her admission form a certificate to this effect from the competent authority along with her Income Certificate.
- Foreign students must produce their certificate of eligibility from the Panjab University alongwith their admission. No application for admission will be considered without it.
- 6. Students migrating from any other University/Board shall have to supply the following documents at the time of admission:
  - (i) Original detailed marks certificate.
  - (ii) Proof of having passed the previous examination.
  - (iii) Inter-University Migration Certificate.
- 7 Local migration of students shall be allowed only for valid reason.

### PROCEDURE OF ADMISSION

#### Admission made on selective basis:

- Students seeking admission to college shall obtain copies of prospectus from the Accounts Office on cash payment.
- 2. Admission form duly filled in should be accompanied by copies of results of all examinations previously passed alongwith original certificates and character certificate from the institution last attended.
- Concessions are available to the meritorious students, outstanding players, speakers, singers, artists and
  actors having shown meritorious achievement in their respective field. Certificate to this effect from the
  appropriate authority should be produced while seeking admission.
- 4. Failed and compartment cases will be admitted only on availability of seats.
- 5. Admission cannot be claimed as a matter of right. Decision of the admission committee will be final and binding. Admission can be cancelled at any time on disciplinary grounds.

### CHANGE OF SUBJECT/S

- 1. Students may apply on the prescribed form with a fee of ₹ 50/- for the change of subject within the 10 days from the date of commencement of classes or the time limit set by Panjab University.
- 2. Such applications must be signed by the father/guardians of the applicant.
- 3. Change of subject/s will be allowed only if college dues are cleared.

### **RULES REGARDING PAYMENT OF DUES**

- 1. Obtaining of receipt for the payment made is the responsibility of incumbent. The college will not be responsible for any payment made without receipt.
- 2. Cheques are not accepted for the payment of college dues.
- 3. Fees, once paid, is not refunded/adjusted.
- 4. If a student leaves the college without prior intimation/permission, she will have to pay the fees for the whole period of that term except in the case of migration.
- 5. Appropriate fine will be imposed if dues are not paid on the scheduled date. On the last day of month, her name shall be considered to have been struck off for the non-payment of fees.
- 6. The name once struck off, however will continue to be on the rolls. It will be removed only when a written application from the candidate duly signed by the father/ guardian is submitted. The lectures attended during that period will not be counted.
- 7. Extension in the date for the payment of dues may be granted by the Principal only before the due date in the deserving cases.
- 8. Absence from the college with or without permission will not entitle a student for non-payment of fees on the due date.

### **LEAVE RULES**

- 1. Leave should be got personally sanctioned before it is availed of.
- Leave for more than two days will be allowed by the Principal only after the recommendation of the Tutor concerned.
- 3. Reason and the date of leave must be stated clearly in the prescribed form.
- 4. Leave upto two days will be sanctioned by the Chief Tutor on his/her recommendation.
- 5. Cases of the students absenting themselves from the examinations without leave will be dealt with according to rules. Such leave applications must reach the Principal before examination.
- All applications for sick leave should be accompanied by a Medical Certificate issued by a Registered Medical Practitioner.
- 7. Students must pay their dues before proceeding on leave.
- 8. All leave applications should be deposited in the office on the day the leave is granted.
- Absence from the college without any permission will not be entertained as an excuse for non payment of college dues.
- 10. A student will get only 12 leaves during a year.
- 11. A student who remain absent for 5 consecutive days without any information to the college authorities, her name will be struck off from the rolls.
- 12. A student may be re-admitted on the college rolls only after getting approval from the Principal and paying a sum of ₹500.

### CODE OF CONDUCT

The code of conduct of Dasmesh Girls College is mandatory for all the students. Students are required to maintain the decorum and dignity of the college by showing respect to their teachers and the administrative staff. They need to keep the campus clean. They are expected to come in simple dress.

## UNIVERSITY EXAMINATION RULES

The semester examinations will be conducted by Panjab University in December 2019 & May 2020. A student will be eligible to appear only if she has:

- 1. Remained on the rolls of the college for the academic year preceding the examinations.

- 3. Secured at least 25% marks in aggregate of all the subjects in the House Examinations.

  - 2. Illness or any other reason for a long absence does not entitle a student to get her lecture shortage condoned.
