Program Outcome Department of Fine Arts B.A. Fine Arts (Elective Subject)

The course comprises of Fine Arts practical and History of Art, and aims to familiarize the students with a holistic concept of the subject through study of both practical and theory together.

PO I: Students will learn about the basic elements of Visual Arts i.e. line, proportion and colour. Students will be able to avail the awareness of implementing the different elements of art in art works.

PO II Students will understand the concept of principal of arts by studying Perspective, Foreshortening and Chairoscuro.

PO III: The students will understand about the different phases of development of art in India. Student will also learn about the material, technique and characteristics of Indian Painting of Prehistoric Indian Painting and Ajanta Cave Painting.

PO IV: Students will learn about the technique and characteristics of Palm Leaf Miniature Painting and Mughal Miniature Paintings.

The students will be encouraged to familiarize themselves with the art forms as seen from the books, slides and related films. Visits to Museums, exhibitions and art galleries are a part of study.

Couse Outcome

- Foundational Understanding: Students gain a foundational understanding of various aspects of fine arts, including art history, different artistic techniques, and basic principles of visual arts.

- **Professional Development**: Some elective subjects may introduce students to basic concepts of art entrepreneurship, exhibition practices, art education, preparing them for potential career paths in the arts.

- **Interdisciplinary Study**: Elective subjects may offer opportunities for interdisciplinary study, allowing students to explore connections between fine arts and other fields such as psychology, sociology, environmental studies or cultural studies. This interdisciplinary approach can enrich their artistic practice and expand their understanding of the role of art in society.
- **Preparation for Advanced Study or Careers**: The second year of the B.A. Fine Arts program prepares students for further academic study at the undergraduate or graduate level, as well as for careers in various fields within the arts, including fine art practice, art education, museum curator, arts administration, photographer, art teacher, illustrator, graphic, sculptor, exhibition manager, graphic designer, rangoli artsist and more.
