Keeping in mind the convenience of students, the college, this year is likely to induct BSc (Medical). 43 University toppers in different streams have brought laurels to the College to be followed by District position (1st and 3rd) In addition five books have been edited by the members of faculty in different streams including one book of Hindi written by our scholars. The highest commendable achievement of the College is that during their service as many as five teachers have completed their Ph.D degrees and five are still in the process. The highest achievement of the College is the establishment of Guru Gobind Singh Research Centre. The book, on sacrificing achievements of the Saint –Soldier has already been printed.

Academic excellence with the dazzle of extra-mural and co-curricular glory gets doubled. To encourage the sensitivity of students, the college offers challenging Co-curricular and extra-curricular programmes designed to raise multi-cultural awareness and understanding in them so that they may develop a sense of global citizenship. Besides they promote national integration through different cultural activities presented on the stage. Our artists exhibited a colourful programme in 2018-19 winning 49 prizes comprising of (12 First- both (Group and Individual) followed by 23 second (Group and Individual) and 14 Third both (Group and Individual) in Panjab University Zonal Youth Festival.

Sports

In addition to academics and extra- mural activities a plethora of activities are arranged outside the classroom in the picturesque campus of the college. The sole purpose of such activities is to boost the mental morale of girls to achieve innate courage and intrinsic ability to face the hurdles and oddities of life with fortitude. To keep the students physically agile and mentally sound, sports are introduced in the College.

The Department of Sports also arranges Athletic Meet every year to prepare students for different competitions. During the session 2018-19, our sportspersons like Anamika Parmar , Hitakshi, Pritee and Sita Devi got two Gold, one Silver and one Bronze in Inter College competition in Weight Lifting.

To trim the mental acumen and to equip the faculty with intellectual sharpness, the college publishes an International Journal under the title Vision with ISSN where articles from eminent scholars are invited and published. Four such magazines are already published and the fifth one is in process. The institute also flashes an annual publication of Dharat, which is a compendium of the thoughts of different teachers and students. In addition, the College invariably arranges religious scholars to impart moral, intellectual and spiritual discourses to the growing youth so that they may follow the track of righteousness in life. This year as many as 50 students participated in Ethical education and appeared in the examination under the auspices of Guru Gobind Singh Study Circle Ludhiana. This was followed by around 200 students who expressed their spiritual salvation in the Holy dip of Shri Sahij Paath. In Ethical Education, 80 students appeared. This was organised by Punjabi People Follower Organization. Around 17 students expressed their holy concern in the participation of Dharam Parchar Committee hosted by S.G.P.C.

During the session 2018-19 Swacch Bharat Abhiyan was carried out to clean not only our Campus but also our surroundings. This was followed by different lectures delivered on Female Foeticide, Domestic Violence. General Awareness Day was also celebrated. In addition, as many as 50 students donated their blood. And for it, an eminent team from the Civil Hospital came to motivate the students about the value of donating blood. The “Health Day” was observed with zeal and gusto where students were advised to take yogic exercises daily to keep themselves fit and healthy.

A National seminar was held on "Academic Innovations and Administrative Reforms to Meet Global Challenges in Higher Education" organized by Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) on March 2, 2019. Dr. Anju Suri (HOD of Dept. of History PU (Chandigarh), Dr. Jigar Mohammed (Dept. of History, Jammu University), Dr. Rajesh Kumar (Dept. of Social Sciences, GNDU Amritsar) and Dr. Raj Kumar (Dept. of Law, Jammu University) participated in the Seminar. A One Day Workshop was organized by Career Development Cell of the College, on 23 Feb, 2019. The Resource Person was a prominent Professor from Lovely Professional University.

An Extension Lecture was organized by Department of Education, on the Topic "Micro Teaching" in which Dr. Ruchi Bhargawa (Resource Person) delivered the lecture on "Different Teaching Skills" on March 9, 2019. Another Extension Lecture was organized by Department of Chemistry, on the Topic "Conceptualization of Photo-Chemistry" by Dr. Sumanjit Kaur (Resource Person) on March 16, 2019. A One Day Exhibition was organized by Dept. of Fashion Designing, on 16 April 2019. The Resource Person for this occasion was from BBK DAV Women College, Amritsar. She demonstrated few creative articles from different fabric painting techniques. An Extension Lecture was conducted on April 10th, 2019 to remember the 100 years of Jallianwala Bagh Massacre of 1919. Mrs. Maninder Kaur from the Department of History was the main orator of this programme. She expressed her views on Jallianwala Bagh Massacre, its impact on National Movement. All the teachers and students paid homage to the martyrs of the aforesaid tragedy. The Department of Political Science organized an Extension Lecture on "Human Rights: In Indian Perspective" on 15 Feb, 2019 and Mr. Sanjeev Kumar Sharma came to address the students on the occasion. He is the President of NGO named A4C. During the discussion with the students he explained that equality, liberty and fraternity are the essentials to protect Human Rights. The Department of Music Organized a One Day Workshop on the topic 'Bhartiya Sangeet Vibhinn Gyan Shailion Ka Gyan' on 9th March, 2019. Renowned artist of Classical and Semi-Classical Vocalist Dr. Monika Soni from PGGC College, Sector 11, Chandigarh presented different 'Gyan Shailies' of Indian Music in different Ragas. She presented Drut Khyal, Thumri, Dadra, Tappa, Raagmala, Bhajan and Shabad on the occasion. On this occasion Tabla Player Shri. Gurinder Singh accompanied her. A One Day Workshop was organised by Department of Fine Arts Prof. Usha from SBBSMG College, Sukhanand, Moga came as a Resource Person in the College. She taught the students about making of Open Air Sculptures. She focused on the waste material like tyres. Students transformed waste tyres into beautiful open air sculpture under her guidelines.

The Women Development Cell organized an Extension Lecture on 'Women Safety and their Constitutional Rights'. The resource persons of this event were Advocate, Rajiv Agnihotri and Advocate Balwinder Singh. They defined Women Empowerment as a movement involving Respect, Honor, Safety and Recognition for all women. Recognizing the efforts of

the NSS unit, our college was awarded the Best NSS unit out of 140 college affiliated to Punjab University, Chandigarh.

Dasmesh Girls College always remain at the helm of affairs, be its academic achievements, or its enthusiastic participation in Zonal Youth Festival, Sports, organizing various Extensions lectures, Seminars, Cultural functions etc. We shall continue with our endeavour to maintain this excellent standard of education and extra-mural activities, so that the dream envisioned by the founders of the college to spread the light of knowledge can be materialised.
